It is nice to know that various State Governments have started giving needed importance to the training of Security Guards. Sh. Prakash Singh Badal, Chief Minister of Punjab has already sanctioned Rs. 20 Crores for such project. Sh. Prem Kumar Dhumal, Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh has shown inclination towards similar projects in his state. Soon delegations of State Chapters of CAPSI & APDI shall be meeting respective Chief Ministers to take up such projects in close association with Ministry of Panchayati Raj and Ministry of Social Welfare, Government of India. Our new team at CAPSI & APDI Secretariat is working hard to serve you better. Please feel free to send your views and also report activities of your state/ city so that entire membership is made known about incidents of importance. Your co-operation is needed to make SECURITY POST an effective tool of communication. My heartiest congratulations to Col J R. NATIONAL REPORT PRESENTED TO HOME MINISTER

At a short notice given by the office of the Hon'ble Home Minister, Our Patron, H.H. Maharaja Bhanu Prakash Singh, Chairman Kunwar Vikram Singh and the Secretary General Mr. Mahesh Sharma met the Hon'ble Home Minister at his office on the 16 February 2008 to hand over the copy of the report on the 2nd National Conference of the CAPSI & APDI held on the 26&27 November 2007 at the PHD House, New Delhi. Hon'ble Home Minister appreciated the initiative of the leadership of the CAPSI & APDI in compiling such an informative document, which will prove very useful for future references by the officials of the Home Ministry and also assured of the assistance and



help in implementation process of the Regulatory Acts. The Hon'ble Home Minister informed that recently he has visited the state capital of Chhatisgarh and held the meeting with Government Officials and representative of the Business and Industry of the state, where in the issue of their protection of the business industry was also discussed. He further said that he suggested the participants that the possibility of utilization of the services of the Private Security Companies be explored and he assured that the state & centre govt. will make arrangement for providing necessary protection, material and weapons to such private security companies to enable them to carry out the operational tasks in the state of Chattisgarh and Jharkhand. Kunwar Vikram Singh assured the home minister that a meeting of the willing members of the capsu shall be called soon to discuss the deployment of security guards at the identified locations and establishments. such a task at a very competitive cost and also the state government should assist in procurement of the protection material to the Private Security Companies to enable them to carry out their operational tasks in the state of Chhatisgarh.

HOME MINISTER PREFER WORD "PRIVATE INVESTIGATORS"

During the meeting with Sh. Shivraj Patil Honble home minister he suggested that Private detectives in India should be referred as in "Private Investigators" instead of Private Detectives He expressed that the very word "Detective" to some uncomfortable feeling to the listeners, whereas the word "Investigators" is positive feeling of assurance and professionalism in this field. Kunwar Vikram Singh and Mr. Mahesh Sharma agreed with expressions of the honble home minister. and informed him that P.I. (Private Investigators) is being used internationally while referring to this profession. Kunwar Vikram Singh suggested that the name of the legislation pending in th Rajya Sabha should therefore be changed from Private Detectives Agencies Regulation Bill to Private Investigation Agency Regulation Bill. Sh. Shivraj Patil agreed to his suggestion and told that necessary amendments in the title of the Bill shall be made accordingly.

Kunwar Vikarm singh briefed honble chief minister about the deliberations held at National Conference of CAPSI & APDI. He informed the Honble Chief minister that there are more than two and half lacs private security guards in the state of Delhi He offered to have the Delhi Government in emerging a effective plan to make Delhi a safe place to live. She suggested that the Delhi Govt., Delhi Police and the CAPSI should forge a Bhagidari Scheme and involve Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs) in this process. Smt. Sheila Dixit immediately agreed to this proposal, she sought the help of CAPSI in helping Delhi Transport Department in deployment of guides and passenger facilitators in the uses of newly introduced public transport system in Delhi. She also wanted Special Security Guards and Inspectors to manage traffic and passengers at bus stands all over the Delhi. She immediately issued instructions to the Secy. Transport, Govt. of Delhi and Chairman - Delhi Transport Corporation to hold meetings to address such critical issues. Subsequently Kunwar Vikram Singh, Mr. Mahesh Sharma, Secy. General and Col. Jagat Trikha, Executive Director, Mr. Ramesh Negi, IAS, Chairman and Mg. Director of Delhi Transport Corporation and held intensive discussions on this matter. The meeting with Secy.- Transport is being lined up to give a final shape to the various proposals.

Smt. Sushma Swaraj thanked the delegation and appreciated the efforts of the CAPSI and APDI in compiling the report of their National Conference held during the month of Nov. 2007 at Delhi. She also said that her office will shortly invite the delegation from the APDI for discussions and deliberations on the PDAR bill.

MEETING WITH THE ADVISOR OF THE MINISTRY OF PANCHAYTI RAJ, GOVERNMENT OF INDIA.

The Chairman along with the ED met Mr. Amit Goel, Advisor, Ministry of Panchayti Raj, Govt. of India. at his office and apprised him about the activities of CAPSI and APDI. Kunwar Vikram Singh informed Mr. Goel about the potential to generate employment for the rural youth in the Private Security Industry. He emphasised that Ministry of Panchayti Raj and Youth Affairs should play a vital role in creating training centres at the district level so that the rural youth can be properly trained as per the PSAR Act. Mr. Goel was highly impressed to know the security work force of 50 lacs with the 20% growth rate every year in this sector. He express his desire that the CAPSI and the Ministry of Panchayti Raj should sign a Memorandum of Understanding and develop a joint program to achieve such objectives. Mr. Vijay Tiwari - National Coordinator of the Ministry of Panchayti Raj also participated in the discussion. It was agreed that more than 300 rural training centres should be created throughout the country. A model training centre shall be established at Baitul, Madhya Pradesh.

The Dating Detectives



TIME Magazine features Chairman of CAPSI, APDI

Who has time for traditional village-style matchmaking in a fast-changing India, where the government estimates that up to one-fourth of the population has moved from the towns or villages of their birth? Not Vikas Sharma, a 28-year-old operations manager with an IT company in Mumbai. So, like many in India's mushrooming urban middle class, Sharma began dating someone online, using one of the dozens of matchmaking sites that have flourished in recent years.

"I met a girl on a matrimonial site, and our relationship reached an advanced stage," he says, by which he means they had been chatting and meeting off and on for several months. Although they both lived in Mumbai, Sharma says he was worried that there was "no common link to rely on" to verify the claims she had made about herself online. Where traditional matchmaking may have relied on a mutual relative or family friend to shuttle between the families of potential suitors, verifying their status to one another and helping settle matters such as dowry, Sharma had no such luxury: Instead, he approached Globe Group, a Mumbai-based detective agency,

to check out his potential spouse. The gumshoes quickly established that Sharma's online paramour had been seen checking into a hotel with another man.

"That was it. I confronted her, and it was over," he says. "In the future, I will never get serious about somebody without first having her verified."

Sharma's experience highlights one of the commercial spin-offs of the boom in dot-com dating a massive growth in India's private-detective industry. "Business has skyrocketed since online matrimonial sites appeared on the scene," says Rahul Rai, director of Globe Group which is one of some 1,500 such agencies now operating in India. "Earlier, you'd marry someone your family knew well, or at least had vetted to meet their criteria. Now, with matrimonial sites, people are virtually marrying strangers."

Indian families are accustomed to ascertaining a suitor's social status, family histories and moral character. And given the anonymity that the Internet enables, concerned families are forced to turn to a living, breathing version of Google: "The detective business is growing at 200% to 250% a year," says Kunwar Vikram Singh, head of the Association of Private Detectives of India and owner of Delhi's award-winning detective agency Lancers Network Ltd. "And a sizeable portion of it is premarital verification."

Marital sleuths typically rely on old-fashioned legwork to verify suitors and their families' social and financial background tailing targets around the clock for a week or so, and conducting clandestine inquiries with neighbors, friends and co-workers to unearth any possible dirt. "That's the only way you can really discover the character of a person, which is what most of our clients want," says Singh. "And character is simply decided by whether someone has had a previous sexual relationship."

Indian magazines and newspapers may be full of surveys attesting to loosening sexual strictures among the swelling middle class, but scratch beneath the surface of liberated young India and you will often find the same old social conservatism especially when it comes to marriage. "The thrust remains on preserving family and social stability and cohesion," says Delhi-based sociologist Patricia Oberoi. "Most youngsters are still committed to maintaining their social position through marriage... studies show that as many as 80% youngsters opine arranged marriages are best."

Divorce and property issues get messy when laws of more than one country are involved, so people are extra careful when dealing with émigré suitors. Singh says more and more people are also approaching him for caste verification. In the Hindu system, everyone is born into a caste. Traditionally marriages took place only within castes, and there was little social or economic mobility. That is changing as society evolves, and government affirmative action programs mean an increasing number of lower-caste members now have good jobs and nice houses. Some have taken on upper-caste surnames to avoid lingering stigmas. "But when it comes to marriage, parents want to ensure their children are marrying into the right caste and lineage and are not being deceived," Singh says.

All of which means roaring business for private eyes. The government has recently proposed a Private Detective Agencies Bill to regulate the industry and set minimum qualifications and training standards. Singh supports the move: "It will weed out fly-by-night operators and bring the job the respect it deserves," he says.

Railway Security - a Potential Business.

A detailed and comprehensive letter has been initiated by the Chairman to the Member Railway Board, high lighting the strength of the Private Security and the Detective Companies operating in India with a view of assist the Indian Railway in assisting them in providing the physical security and the Under cover personnel at the railway stations, railway platforms, parking areas, railway godowns / yards and the moving passenger & goods trains at the most economical expenditure out of the rail budget. A request has been made for the date & time for the presentation of the project to the Chairman of the Railway Board as per his convenience. This lead will definitely open the avenues for our members to enhance their business capabilities. We are very hopeful to get the positive response.
